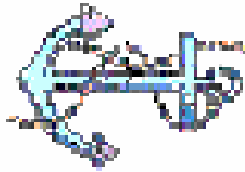


Rear Commodore Bill Wilson

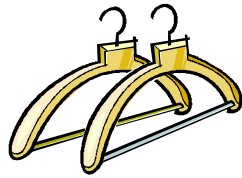

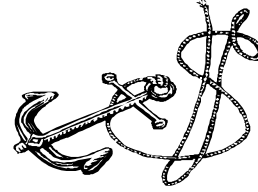


WORK PARTIES JUNE 14th AND 28th
