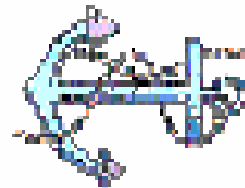


Port Captain

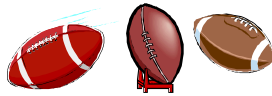

HOW TO SURVIVE A HEART ATTACK IF YOU ARE ALONE

The source of this information is unknown, but was sent to me in an e-mail, and I felt it important enough to pass it on.

You should know that not every heart attack symptom is going to be the left arm hurting. Be aware of intense pain in the jaw line. You may never have the first chest pain during the course of a heart attack. Nausea and intense sweating are also common symptoms. Sixty percent of people who have a heart attack while they are asleep do not wake up. The pain in the jaw happens to many and awakes them from a sound sleep. Trust these symptoms since they tell you its pain unlike anything you have ever experienced before.

Given a choice between natural childbirth and a heart attach, pain wise, it is much easier to have a baby.

Let's be careful and be aware. The more we know, the better chance we could survive.

Let's say it is 6:15 p.m. (and you are alone) after an unusually hard day on the job. You are tired, upset and frustrated. Suddenly you start experiencing severe pain in your chest that starts to radiate up into your arm and up into your jaw. You are about five miles from the hospital nearest your home. You have been trained in CPR, but they did not tell you how to perform it on yourself.

A breath and a cough must be repeated about every two seconds without let-up until the heart is felt to be beating normally. Deep breaths get oxygen into the lungs plus coughing movements squeeze the heart and keep the blood circulating. The squeezing pressure on the heart also helps it regain normal rhythm. In this way, heart attack victims can get to a hospital.

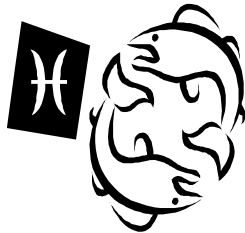
