## Rear Commodore Barbi Carson

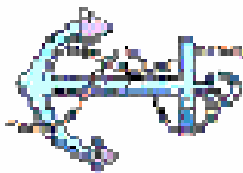

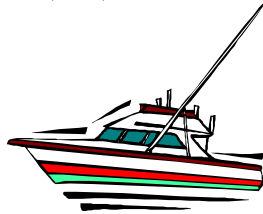


## SOMETHING NEW

### Monterey Sunday Supper Recipe submitted by Sandy Gaedtke

- 1 cup rice – cooked according to directions
- 1 small can chopped Ortega chilies
- 3 zucchini thinly sliced and parboiled
- 3 tomatoes, sliced
- 2 cups sour cream (mix in 1 teaspoon oregano)
- 1 tablespoon garlic salt
- 1 lb. Monterey Jack cheese, shredded (divided)

Spread cooked rice in a 9 x 13 pan. Spread chopped chilies over rice. Top with ½ shredded cheese. Spread zucchini over cheese. Place tomato slices over zucchini. Spread sour cream over tomatoes and top with the rest of the cheese. Bake 350 degrees for 25 – 30 minutes.

When a member hosts a function at the Club, they are provided a packet of very useful information. Please review this material as it will make things a lot easier for you and the Assistant Treasurer.

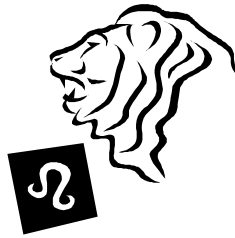
